About the NJO

The Nebraska Jazz Orchestra (NJO) was founded in 1975 and is one of the Midwest’s premier big bands, celebrating over 40 years of great performances. The NJO has toured Europe twice, including a 1997 performance at the prestigious Montreux International Jazz Festival in Switzerland. In 2006, the NJO was featured in a documentary by Nebraska Educational Television entitled “Hard Times Swing,” which followed the development of territory swing bands that changed American pop culture. The NJO was awarded the 2007 Mayor’s Arts Award for Artistic Achievement in the Performing Arts, and has performed with former *Tonight Show* bandleader Doc Severinsen, guitarist James Valentine of *Maroon 5*, and former David Letterman bandleader Paul Shaffer at the Lied Center for Performing Arts in the last several years. To date, the NJO has released eight recordings, including their recent CD celebrating the ensemble’s 40th Anniversary entitled *NJO 40*.

The NJO kicks off its season with “Early Autumn, the music of Woody Herman”. Herman was an American jazz clarinetist, saxophonist, singer, and big band leader.

Leading groups called “The Herd”, Herman came to prominence in the late 1930s and was active until his death in 1987.

His bands often played music that was cutting edge and experimental; their recordings received numerous Grammy nominations. In addition to Jazz, Herman was a well rounded player performing classical works such as Stavinsky’s Ebony Concerto, composed specifically for Herman and his band.

The Young Lions All-Star Band with Doug Hinrichs



A specialist in ethnic percussion (Doug studied in Brazil, the island of Guadeloupe, and Trinidad & Tobago), Doug also performs often on drum set, mallet and orchestra percussion, and steel pan. He is the inventor of the One-Handed Triangle, which is manufactured and sold worldwide by LP (Latin Percussion). He is an LP, Sabian, and Remo endorser. Doug performs and records with countless artists in the New York City area and beyond and has several Broadway show credits to his name. Doug is perhaps best-known for his work in the musical “In The Heights,” for which he played drums and percussion during the show’s developmental years, and held the percussion chair for its full run on Broadway.

“A Salute to Duke Ellington”

Edward Kennedy “Duke” Ellington (April 29, 1899 – May 24, 1974) was an American jazz pianist, composer, and leader of his eponymous jazz orchestra from 1923 through the rest of his life. Considered one of the greatest jazz composers of all time, Duke Ellington had an enormous impact on the popular music of the late 20th century. Having composed more than two thousand songs, his recordings remain among the most popular jazz of the big-band era.
